Below are some Tips to better guide you

When it comes to imports and exports each country has their own sets of regulations and requirements that need to be met so that goods can flow across borders.

The following points will help guide you:

- **Make sure that all your business details are up to date**

- **Identify the goods accurately that you would like to move on a straight [Bill of Lading](#)**

- **Find an experienced custom broker**

Form a network of competent custom brokers to clear your goods in accordance with the International Commercial Terms.

- **Define the country of origin of the goods on your Bill of Lading**

This can have an affect on the duties imposed due to different duty rates, trade agreements, as well as import quotas and trade sanctions.

MEXICO TRADE REQUIREMENTS

Ground transport in Mexico through US can sometimes get complicated in terms of the customs process and logistics. In addition to the list above, anyone who is importing or exporting goods must meet these requirements.

- **Finding a Mexican customs broker**

It is key to find a Mexican customs broker who has complete knowledge about Mexico's trade requirements and laws, so that your import/export process is as seamless as possible.

● You need to be part of the Register of Importers

If you will be importing goods into Mexico, then you must enroll at Mexico's Official Register of Importers. Once registered, then you'll be recognized by the Mexican Tax Authority.

● Get a Certificate of Origin

Any goods arriving in Mexico must have the certificate of origin. Goods will be denied entry if they don't have this certificate.

● The HS Code

As most trading countries including Mexico, who use Harmonized System. This allows the customs broker to see if any tariffs apply to the goods and they meet all the requirements.

● Importing Documents

It is very important to present import documents to Mexican Custom Authorities, this is one of the most important trade documents when importing goods into Mexico. It can only be filled out by a Mexican custom broker and should contain the following information:

- Invoice
- Verification of non-tariffs restrictions and regulations
- Certificate of Origin
- Identification (This may include serial numbers, part numbers, and brand information)
